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Exclusion and Persecution of Jewish Lawyers 1933 - 1938

The nucleus of National Socialist ideology was anti-Semitism . The "25-point programme" of the NSDAP (National Socialist German Workers Party) of 1920 stated: "Only a compatriot can be a citizen of the State. A compatriot can only be a person of pure German lineage, irrespective of [religious] denomination. A Jew can therefore not be a compatriot". Starting from this principle, the National Socialists developed their other objectives, e.g. the removal of Jews from all public offices and to withdraw their registration to practice law or medicine.

Jewish lawyers were a group of professionals particularly hated by the National Socialists. The removal of and discrimination against Jewish lawyers was not least in the economic interests of their "Aryan" colleagues. The first violent attacks against Jews took place almost immediately after the National Socialists took power. Jewish lawyers and judges were barred from attending Courts in numerous German cities. The boycott of 1 April 1933 was directed against Jewish owned retail shops and stores, local Jewish doctors and lawyers. Hans Frank, the then Bavarian Minister of Justice, issued a decree forbidding Jewish lawyers to enter Court buildings with immediate effect. From this moment they were required to submit applications to obtain a special permit to do so. The "Law for the Authorization to practice Law" of 7 April 1933 instantly withdrew this permission from a considerable number of Jewish lawyers. Only Jewish lawyers who had been authorized to practice law prior to 1 August 1914, those who served in the frontline trenches of the 1914 - 1918 war and those whose fathers or sons had fallen in the Field during this period, were henceforth allowed to continue with their professional work.

But a system of bureaucratic harassment began simultaneously for the majority of those Jewish lawyers who were still able to continue with their careers. The "Association of National Socialist Jurists" demanded the complete exclusion of Jews from the German legal structure. The professional Associations of Jurists had been infiltrated by the National Socialists even prior to 1933. The remaining Jewish lawyers now discovered quite quickly that many of their former colleagues turned their backs on them and that former clients were afraid and no longer willing to be represented by them. As a consequence Jewish lawyers were left solely to look after Jewish clients. This became less and less rewarding as the number of clients shrunk by virtue of growing emigration. Many Jewish lawyers were therefore driven to close their law firms in order to avoid financial ruin.

The fifth decree of the German Civil Law of 27 September 1938 (RGBL. I of 14 October 1938, no. 165) required unconditional exclusion of all Jews from the legal profession and for their names to be removed from the lawyers' register latest by 30 November 1938.

This decree was the basis on which the President of the German Association of Jurists ordered the removal of the license to practice from Jewish lawyers with effect from 1 December 1939. Those Jewish lawyers still working at that time had their names published by their respective local jurists' associations indicating that their licenses had now been withdrawn.

The lists shown below are those published by the "Communiqué of the German Association of Jurists" no.12 of 1 December 1939. They list the names of the Jewish lawyers in Bavaria who were members of their local associations and now debarred from exercising their profession. Thereafter a very small number of Jewish lawyers remained in Germany, allowed to describe themselves as "Legal Consultants", and tolerated to act on behalf of none but Jewish clients.

Not that those Jewish lawyers who survived the Shoah, following the end of the National Socialist dictatorship, were re-admitted "en bloc" as lawyers in Germany: each one was obliged to apply individually to be restored to the register to be enabled to plead before the Courts on behalf of clients. Many German Jewish lawyers were killed and only a few of the survivors re-applied.
