THE LEHMAIER FAMILY

MICHAEL JACOB LEHMAIER was born 1786 and died in Baiersdorf in 1848. He was a cloth manufacturer and was married to Ricka SELIGMANN, born in Baiersdorf in about 1783 and died there in 1861. (1) They were the parents of

JOSEPH LEHMAIER was born on 19 March 1808 in Baiersdorf. Joseph moved to Fuerth, his Fuerth "Matrikel" are dated 17 May 1832.

HIRSCH LEHMAIER born 1 January 1810 Baiersdorf

BABETTE LEHMAIER, (4 August 1813 Baiersdorf - 2 March 1868 Munich). On 7 November 1839 she married David AUB, son of great-great-great-grandparents Lekisch and Brendel AUB of Baiersdorf, born on 16 February 1802. For further information see The Aubs of Baiersdorf.

JONAS LEHMAIER born 22 September 1815 Baiersdorf. Between 1825 and 1834 he attended the Gymnasium Fridericianum in Erlangen. In 1834 he started studying medicine at the University Erlangen. He transferred to the University of Munich in 1835 to continue his studies and graduated from there in 1838.

ABRAHAM LEHMAIER was born in Baiersdorf on 28 November 1817. He attended the Gymnasium Fridericianum in Erlangen between 1827 - 1831. (2) He appears to have at first followed his brother to Fuerth where he received his "Matrikel" on 10 April 1845, before eventually emigrating.

MOSES LEHMAIER born 29 November 1819 Baiersdorf. Like his brothers he also attended the Gymnasium Fridericianum in Erlangen (3) as a "Hospitant" (4) between 1832 and 1836. Moses (later changed name to Morris LEMAIRE) emigrated to the United States and around 1850 married Rosalie SELIGMANN (1826 - 1905), daughter of David SELIGMANN of Baiersdorf. Rosalie with her sister and some of her brothers had emigrated in 1842 to join her elder brothers in America. (See The Seligmanns of Baiersdorf). Their children: (5)

Louis LEMAIRE (2 March 1853 - 18 December 1914)

appears to have been single. In 1905, the year of death of his mother Rosalie, he endowed the Rosalie Lehmaier'sche Stiftung (a charitable foundation) in her memory as an addition to the David and Fanny Seligmann'sche Kinderstiftung, which made the building of the Children's Home in Baiersdorf named after them possible.
